SANDRA EITHUN, M.M.Ed--is a graduate of Silver Lake College in Manitowoc, WI, with an emphasis in the Kodály teaching method, keyboard, and flute. She currently resides in Appleton, WI, and has been serving as Director of Music Ministry at First Congregational United Church of Christ in New London, WI since 1992. At her church, Sandra is the director of three handbell choirs, serves as choral accompanist, and organist/keyboardist. She directed the Silver Lake College Handbell Ensemble for eleven years, is an active member of the Handbell Musicians of America and has served on their Area VII Board of Directors. She has been commissioned to write music for many events and for numerous individual handbell ensembles. Most recently, she received the honor of being given the esteemed Donald E. Allured Original Composition Award for the 2020 Week of Handbells in Bay View, MI. She has over 350 pieces for handbells in publication as well as several sacred keyboard books and teaching collections for the incorporation of handbells in the music classroom. In 2013, Sandra had the honor of working alongside Doc Severinsen and the Fox Valley Symphony to include handbells in his holiday show, "Jingle Bell Doc" at the Fox Cities Performing Arts Center in Appleton, WI. She continues to work as a handbell clinician and conductor at numerous festivals and workshops throughout the United States.

Violin



A child learns his/her native language because he/she hears it spoken from the day of birth. The Suzuki approach calls this the "Mother Tongue" approach. In the same way, the child who hears music every day will learn the language of music. Suzuki violin group classes emphasize having fun, playing skill games together, and reinforcing previously learned pieces.

[Piano Classes](#) for children and adults are designed to help them discover the world of piano through games, ear training, rhythm activities and keyboard playing. Students will learn new pieces each week and have performances. Piano is one of the most natural instruments to approach. Taking piano class improves coordination, memory, social skills, and attention to details.
